Dual Credit Courses

Anatomy and Physiology (HLHS 102)*
Medical Terminology (HLHS 101)*

Three credits per Dual Credit Course

*Must have a 2.6 GPA or pass the Knowledge Assessment to earn dual credits in Anatomy and Physiology, and Medical Terminology.

High School Credit Courses

Four credits per semester. Counts as a Directed Elective or Elective for the General, Core 40, Core 40 with Academic Honors and Core 40 with Technical Honors diplomas.

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Students learn about the human body and its functions, along with many triage situations encountered as a Medical Assistant such as working in a doctor's office, taking vitals (blood pressure, pulse, respiration, temperature, etc.), venipuncture, syringe fill, ECG's, urinalysis, prescription writing, and dosage calculations. Students may also earn CPR, HIPAA, FEMA, NHACCMA, and Bloodborne Pathogen certifications.

REQUIREMENTS

- C or higher in Algebra I (emphasis on fractions, ratios, and proportions)
- Ability to communicate effectively (written and verbal)
- No discipline referrals
- No more than ten absences per year
- Must be able to handle a very structured environment (rules, policies, procedures)
- Health Science Education I as a recommended prerequisite
